A Safe Workplace Means:

- You can report concerns or unsafe situations without retaliation
- You have access to safety information and support resources
- You are protected from harassment, abuse, and intimidation

You Should Expect:

- A respectful, supportive response when you ask for help
- Privacy when discussing personal or safety concerns
- Clear information about workplace policies and acceptable conduct
- Support for your safety decisions and boundaries

Know Your Options:

- You may request time off for safety-related needs, including medical, legal, or counseling appointments
- You can ask for changes to your work schedule or job duties to help keep you safe
- Protections vary by state and workplace size—it's okay to ask questions about what applies to you
